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Call for Papers NAAHoLS at LSA

The 2013 NAAHoLS meeting will again be held in conjunction with the Linguistic Society of America, the American Dialect Society, the Society for the Study of the Indigenous Languages of the Americas, and the Society for Pidgin and Creole Linguistics.

The annual meeting will take place in Boston, Massachusetts between 3-6 January, 2013. Further details about the meeting will be provided in the next newsletter (to be distributed Summer 2012), and information will also be available on-line at <naahols.org>.

As in the past, we invite papers relating to any aspect of the history of the language sciences. All presenters must be members of the association (contact the NAAHoLS Secretary for details). Papers will be 20 minutes, with 10 minutes for discussion. Abstracts should be submitted as file attachments (MS Word). The length of the abstract should not exceed 500 words – upon acceptance, a shorter (100 word) abstract will also be requested for the meeting handbook. **The deadline for abstracts is 1 September 2012.**

23rd International Colloquium of the SGdS (Studienkreis ‘Geschichte der Sprachwissenschaft’)

Leuven, Belgium (23-25 August 2012)

Der “Studienkreis ‘Geschichte der Sprachwissenschaft’” lädt zu seinem XXIII. Internationalen Kolloquium ein, das in Kooperation mit Pierre Swiggers und Toon Van Hal (Leuven) vom Donnerstag, den 23. (Anreisetag) bis zum Samstag, den 25. August 2012 an der Katholischen Universität Leuven stattfinden wird. Die Wahl der Vortragsthemen ist — wie bei den allgemeinen Treffen des *SGdS* üblich — innerhalb des sprachwissenschaftlich historiographischen Rahmens frei; jedoch sind Beiträge zum Themenschwerpunkt “Sprach(en)vielfalt” sehr willkommen. Wir bitten alle Interessenten, besonders aber diejenigen, die einen Vortrag halten möchten, sich möglichst bald, spätestens aber bis zum 15. Januar 2012 mit der Angabe des Vortragstitels und eines Abstracts anzumelden. Die Vortragsanmeldungen werden in der zeitlichen Reihenfolge ihres Eingangs berücksichtigt ('first come, first get'). Die Vortragsdauer wird maximal 30 Minuten betragen (mit anschließender Diskussion von ca. 10 Minuten); Vortrags- und Diskussionssprachen sind Deutsch, Englisch und Französisch.
