Call for Papers (2nd notice) NAAHoLS at LSA

The 2019 NAAHoLS meeting will again be held in conjunction with the Linguistic Society of America, the American Dialect Society, the American Name Society, the Society for the Study of the Indigenous Languages of the Americas, the Society for Computation in Linguistics, and the Society for Pidgin and Creole Linguistics. Featured LSA plenary speakers this year include Diane Lillo-Martin (University of Connecticut), Jennifer Cole (Northwestern U), and Penelope Eckert (Stanford U).

The annual meeting will take place in New York City (Sheraton Hotel) from 3-6 January 2019. Details about the meeting will be available in the coming months.

As in the past, we invite papers relating to any aspect of the history of the language sciences. All presenters must be members of the association (contact the NAAHoLS Secretary for details). Papers will be 20 minutes, with 10 minutes for discussion. Abstracts should be submitted as file attachments (MS Word). The length of the abstract should not exceed 500 words – upon acceptance, a shorter (100-word) abstract will also be requested for the LSA meeting handbook. **The deadline for NAAHoLS abstracts is 1 September 2018.**

Maynooth University, Ireland (5-8 September 2018)

Registration is now open for the 2018 Annual Colloquium of the Henry Sweet Society for the History of Linguistic Ideas, to be held at Maynooth University in Ireland from 5-8 September 2018. The overall theme of this year’s colloquium will be “Historical Approaches to Etymology,” and we are delighted to be hosting 45 speakers from 15 countries this year, with papers on over 20 different languages.
